Talk to your parents

“We recommend that minors over the age of 13 ask their parents for permission before sending any information about themselves to anyone over the Internet.”

Don't expect privacy

“unless you're prepared to attach something in your profile to a resume or scholarship application, don't post it.”

- Facebook Safety Help

What you post stays forever

“Where you make use of the communication features of the service to share information with other individuals on Facebook, ... you generally cannot remove such communications.”

If it's not nice, don't say it

“you agree not to use the Service or the Web site to:

- upload, post, email, transmit or otherwise make available any content that we deem to be harmful, threatening, abusive, harassing, vulgar, obscene, hateful, or racially, ethnically or otherwise objectionable;
- intimidate or harass another;”

- Facebook Terms of Service

Keep yourself safe

- Use the privacy settings, but don't rely on them
- Only friend people you know and trust
- Avoid joining regional networks.
- Don't put personal/contact information in wall messages or in comments to pictures or notes
- Be weary of posting contact information.
